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VI. Reading Comprehension (60 Marks)

Read the following passage, then answer the questions below:

In certain undeveloped countries like Bangladesh, India and Africa, children have barely enough food to eat. Let alone the fancy clothes, toys and other things that children of more developed countries are lucky enough to have. Instead of going to school to gain good education, children in undeveloped countries have to work from a young age from four or five years old. By the age of twelve, most of them are given the responsibilities of looking after and supporting their families **who** are weak from hunger and ill health.

Lacking of any form of education from such a young age, these poor children are forced to take up illegal jobs which are often dangerous and unsuitable for them. Since it is illegal for young children to work, the factories that hire them always hide those children away from the main working areas. The children are trapped for a long time in dark and dirty working places. In India for example, there are children who work in factories which **manufacture** matches that are used for lighting and fire. Not only do these children risk their lives by working, but they are also paid the low salaries.

In 1990, The United Nations encourages countries to prohibit the import of products made by children under age 15. This threat let to great panic in Bangladesh garment industries, which immediately **dismissed** child workers. However, once the attention disappeared after some time, it was back to business for companies, but more secretly this time.

Even though the factories may be exploiting children by paying them low salaries, they don't provide them with more or less safe working environment and suitable jobs. They don't even care for those children's health or nutrition. Dismissing children from work doesn't necessarily mean that they will no longer work. In fact, those children may end up in the hands of drug dealers and lead a life of criminals.
